For almost 8 years in my missionary service, you have sustained your support in whatever means. It was unfortunate that I could not visit you and your churches because of the pandemic. But thank you for being present in my "In Mission Episode" where I had several opportunities to share the stories of people and our ministry in Laos.

Secondly, I thank God for giving me opportunities to work with our Global Missionaries and Global Mission Fellows in carrying out God's mission with love, compassion, patience, and perseverance. We encountered many challenges, but these challenges also served as opportunities to share God's love and understanding of God's mission. Finally, I praise God for letting me participate in God's mission. It is a noble calling where my faith is tested, tried, and lived out. Working with people from diverse backgrounds was so humbling and empowering at the same time. My listening and communication skills were further enhanced, and I have learned so many things that challenged me to be a better, more caring, and loving person.

Now, God has a new plan for me as I went back to the Philippines for medical reasons. This would be a journey of faith where self-care is needed. I covet all your prayers in this medical journey. I am constantly reminded by 2 Cor 12:9, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

Thank you for all your prayers, financial support, and accompaniment in many of our mission works and ministries.

May the kindness and blessings of the Lord Jesus Christ be upon you. May you continue to experience and share God's love. May the Holy Spirit be our spiritual compass. Amen.

- 6. Chaddock maintains a Special Education School and also provides in home intensive programs.
- 7. Chaddock provides residential on-site treatment as needed.
- 8. Chaddock is nationally and internationally known for providing training and health consultation services to educators, therapists and others who serve children and families.

Since 1853, Chaddock's services and programs have grown with the support of Methodist churches, into a full-service institution that assists severely challenged children and families. We, as United Methodists, can be proud of the part we have played in assisting with its growth and far-reaching Christian outreach.

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ in the power and presence of the Holy Spirit.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the last week I found myself in several stores, going through the normal process of shopping for the items needed for one thing or another. As I walked through the stores I noticed three things, One, the stores were playing Christmas music, normally reserved for black Friday and beyond; two, the section of Christmas decorations was smaller than previous years (although, perhaps they are not set up in full yet); and three, the people I saw looked tired, worried, and mostly defeated. On one particular day, after noticing the look of the people, I caught a glimpse of myself in an inconveniently placed mirror, and noticed I looked about as worn out as they did.

All of this sent me into a time of reflection over the past year, noting many of the difficult, aggravating, and heart-breaking moments that had made up 2024. I had my own little pity party and then I heard a voice that said, "but you weren't alone." Then, I thought, that's right, "Lord, You have been there with me all along."

Sometimes the Lord can seem very far away, other times He can seem so close that you can almost reach out and touch Him. I can't always explain it, but I know He is there. But when I look back and reflect, I can see His footprints walking next to mine, and as the writer of Footprints noted, I too can see the times He was carrying me.

We are about to enter into "the most wonderful time of the year," and not for all the reasons the song listed, but rather for the one who made the season possible to begin with. Jesus Christ came into the world to save us from our sins, and to show us by His blood shed on the cross the depth of love our God has for us. In this we can rejoice knowing that He came for us.

The Advent – Christmas season brings with it a special kind of JOY because of the one who's birth made angels sing and shepherds and wise men bow down and worship. It is a time when we reflect on the HOPE we have in Christ, the PEACE that comes from a relationship with Him, the LOVE made known in the Christ who died for us, the inexpressible JOY that is ours through the indwelling Spirit of God, and the assurance that not only is God with us but that one day we will spend eternity with Him.


