Angie started her Chemo yesterday. She will have 6 months of treatment. Her cancer is very rare. Her husband is with her to support and do all he can to keep her in good spirits, make sure she eats and keeps strong. She is in the Philippines, her home country, during this time, staying with her sister's family. This is a difficult time for everyone . Please continue to pray and think of her!

As for Connie, the funds so many have sent from America continue to put the language center in a healthy place: electrical wiring has been replaced and I hope that will take care of fires (\$65); the molded ceiling hole in my office was replaced (\$45); the damaged and rotting trees on the property were taken down and trimmed yesterday (\$130); a printer and computer was purchased as the other mission initiative office took ours (\$650). Next is budgeting a security guard for the Center to stay in the guard house, including weekends. We have no one at night and our equipment is at risk or if a fire or midnight rain caused damage, no one would know until the next morning. There is also grounds upkeep. This person would be \$70 a month, \$840 per year. I am looking into reliable companies to provide this service. More students are coming and my free Friday classes at the primary school continue. We are progressing! Hallelujah! And the Laos staff is amazing. We pray together every morning, and their support is such a comfort. God is good!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, I greet you in the name of Almighty God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. As I write this letter, I am listing to the postponed 2020 General Conference of the United Methodist Church, going on for a couple more days in Charlotte, North Carolina. Many actions have taken place, and there are some who are celebrating while others are heartsick by the direction our beloved United Methodist Church is heading. News articles are coming out with spin from all sides. The question I am receiving is, what does this mean? The truth is, as of now I would have to say I am not sure. Over the coming days I will be pouring over the legislation passed by General Conference to try and determine what has truly taken place. What I can tell you is that the actions of the General Conference are likely to have changed the nature of our denomination. The way forward is fuzzy, and some actions of the General Conference will need to be ratified by a 2/3 majority vote of the Annual Conferences that make up our worldwide church. This will take some time. Some estimates project that we will not know the answer until fall of 2025. I promise that I will share with you my understanding of these actions as soon as I am able. As always, I welcome your questions, but will note that my answers will be limited for the next couple of weeks as I try to come to a full understanding. I know that this is not an adequate answer for now, but it is the one I have. So, what do I know for sure?

• I know that as a pastor and as a church, we must be about the Father's work. The work God has called us to is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We are to share the lifesaving message of the Gospel. There are many in this world who do not know God, who need salvation through Jesus Christ. As the Apostle Peter, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit put it, **"There is salvation in no one else! God has given no other name under heaven by which we must be saved." Acts 4:12 NLT** That name is Jesus Christ, and we must proclaim that message with all our hearts so that many more will know that we have a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.

• I know that when we repent of our sins and commit ourselves to Jesus Christ, we are forgiven of our sins and are made new. As the Apostle Paul, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit said, **"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." 2 Corinthians 5:17 ESV** 

• I know that the Bible **"reveals the Word of God so far as it is necessary for our salvation. It** is to be received through the Holy Spirit as the true rule and guide for






