2021 Annual Conference, Illinois Great River Conference (IGRC)

This year it was once again a privilege to represent our church at the Annual Conference on June 11th and 12th. This year's conference theme was, "A Time to Heal".

Bishop Frank J. Beard presided over the conference and I found him to be a warm and inspirational church leader. Bishop Beard is in his fifth year as leader of the Illinois Area. He is a gifted spiritual teacher with a passion for Christ that is contagious.

As stated by Bishop Beard, the laceration and abrasions caused by the Covid-19 Pandemic, the wounds of division, the gashes of racism, the polarizing harmful hurts of our political divide, the painful injuries of unemployment and poverty, along with the damaging discussions about schism have left us all in need of the healing "balm In Gilead". I interpreted these remarks as a personal challenge to make a difference as I continue forward, in my faith journey. I hope you do as well.

Bishop Beard is currently suffering with an eye condition that is affecting is vision. He will be taking a medical leave of absence for the remainder of this year and has vowed to return with or without his eyesight. In his absence, Bishop Gregory Vaughn Palmer has been selected as our interim Bishop.

What do lay members do?

Lay members are a key link between their local church or charge and other churches of the Illinois Great Rivers Annual Conference. They serve as principal communicators between the local church or charge and the global church. Lay members are full participants, along with clergy members of the annual conference, in making decisions on all the issues before the IGRC (except on matters of ordination, character, and conference relations of clergy). Lay members have year-round responsibilities in their local church, where by virtue of office, they are members of the charge conference, church council, staff/pastor parish committee, and the finance committee.

Members of and visitors to the Annual Conference are renewed for the mission of the church through worship of God, which includes inspirational preaching by Bishop Beard and others, sacred music and praise songs led by choirs and musicians, Holy Communion, and the commissioning and ordination of deacons and elders.

Mission for the Month, Advance Special #00381A: The Mama Lynn Center (East Congo)

Outreach

The Mama Lynn Center was initiated by Bishop Gabriel of the East Congo Episcopal area who opted for the creation and construction of a treatment and training center for

girls and women who were victims of sexual violence. This Center was named in honor of the spouse of Bishop William T. McAlilly, who made significant contributions towards the construction of the buildings for the Mama Lynn Centre. The mandate of the Mama Lynn Center is to restore dignity, to build self-confidence, and to improve the life expectancy rates of girls and women in the East Congo Episcopal Area. Since its creation, the Mama Lynn Center has trained more than 120 women in vital life-sustaining skills: Sewing, cooking (learning how to bake and sell goods for profit), weaving and knitting, soap-making, agricultural expertise (growing vegetables) and entrepreneurship skills. Trainees also include some wives of pastors in the region. There are 3 different centers: One in Kindu (educating 80), Goma (25) and Kisangani (35). Aside from training, the centers offer supportive activities organized by the women themselves and also help provide micro credit support to pastor's wives to help supplement extremely limited incomes of church ministers.

The mission dollars collected by our church will go toward buying sewing machines for the Center. One sewing machine is \$150 US. Currently, the Center must share 1 machine among 4 women during sewing classes. Let's see if we can provide the women trainees with at least two. Checks can be made out to Marshall First UMC. earmarked "Mama Lynn Center" or "Sewing machines," and given to the church office or placed in the offertory.




