Mission News for —February 2023 newsletter



Our mission project for this month is the Solar Oven Project. The Dakota Annual Conference began this project several years ago and it has grown since then. Over 2,000 solar ovens have been sent to the Dominican Republic. Volunteers accompany each shipment to help teach people how to use them. Solar ovens provide enough heat for cooking and sterilizing water. They are cheaper than bottle gas and help stop deforestation which is occurring at an

alarming rate. Also many diseases are prevented by the use of safe drinking water. Each oven comes with a cooking pot and utensils. We will have one at the church this month for you to see. This mission is a memorial for Glen Buskirk who was an enthusiastic solar oven supporter.

Rev. Bill & Becky Wiggs will be coming to lead us starting July 1, 2023. Pastor Bill has been under continuous appointment or assignment by a United Methodist Bishop since Father's Day 1992. He graduated from Asbury Theological Seminary in 1999, ordained in the Illinois Great Rivers Conference as a Deacon in 1998, and an Elder in 2001.
