Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is hard to believe that two months have already passed since Becky, Kathy, and I arrived in Marshall. In this time, we have already come to love this community and the Marshall First Church family. Your welcome has been much appreciated, and we are enjoying getting to know you all. Some of you already feel like old friends and family that we are just reconnecting with.

The other day I was mindlessly scrolling through Facebook and found a post from one of my new Marshall friends that said, "It's that time of year, when the corn and soybeans start taking on a different look, the days get shorter, cooler temperatures, and fall festivals are just a few weeks from beginning...and you know what that means, right?!



The older I get, the more I enjoy the simple things of life, a hot pumpkin spice coffee on a cool day, the beauty of the colors of changing leaves, the laughter of a small child, and the many other little things that make up the beauty of life. As I think about all of this, I am reminded of Solomon's words in Ecclesiastes 3.

For everything there is a season, a time for every activity under heaven. ²A time to be born and a time to die. A time to plant and a time to harvest. ³A time to kill and a time to heal. A time to tear down and a time to build up. ⁴A time to cry and a time to laugh. A time to grieve and a time to dance. ⁵A time to scatter stones and a time to gather stones. A time to embrace and a time to turn away. ⁶A time to search and a time to quit searching. A time to keep and a time to throw away. ⁷A time to tear and a time to mend. A time to be quiet and a time to speak. ⁸A time to love and a time to hate. A time for war and a time for peace.

I once thought this passage was simply about the activities of life, but now I have come to recognize that Solomon was simply writing about the human condition. Our lives are made up of so many wonderful and terrible events it would seem that many of them are meaningless. In fact, this seems to be the attitude of Solomon. Here he was, wealthy and powerful, seemingly on top of the world, still he writes, "Meaningless! Meaningless!" "Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless." (Ecclesiastes 1:1) This has always puzzled me. As I look at the world all I see is meaning, but as I look at the people around me, I see that most people look at life and the world the same way it seems Solomon does. So many people are lost, feeling alone even in a crowded room, seeing nothing but meaninglessness in the world and in life, which leads to hopelessness. But there is hope!

There is hope because God brings order to the chaos all around us. As the church we stand in the place of Christ, looking at people through His eyes. "When Jesus saw the crowds, He had compassion on them because they were confused and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." This is the way we should look at the people around us, with compassion. But this compassion is not simply pity for the human condition, it is a productive kind of compassion; a compassion that acts to offer hope into hopeless lives. Our compassion should spread God's love and grace and invite others into a relationship with the One who can change their mindset from hopelessness to everlasting hope. This is my challenge to you. As you interact with those around you, think about how Christ would interact with them, and do likewise.

"The massive losses from last week's Maui, Hawaii', wildfires included the beloved and historic Lahaina United Methodist Church sanctuary, as well as the homes of some congregation members.

Pastor John Crewe said he has been able to determine that no church members have been injured or killed, but many are displaced as is he and his family.."

Midwest Distribution Center is coordinating with partners to provide supplies as they learn about needs. It will be partnering with Convoy of Hope, based in Springfield, Mo., who will handle shipping and shipping costs. MMDC will send bed packs, hygiene kits, and rice meals. They will send more supplies when requested.

This will allow MMDC to purchase supplies as needs arise as well as replenish supplies that are being shipped. You can use the pew envelopes provided or leave your donations in the church office. 
