Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

A few days ago, Becky and I took some time with family at the Great Pumpkin Patch in Arthur, Illinois. It was wonderful to see all the fall activities through the eyes of our threeyear-old granddaughter. I loved everything about that trip, even the trip itself. The drive was beautiful, seeing the farmers working to bring in the harvest. Some fields already empty, others ready to harvest. The trees in various stages of shedding their leaves, some in beautiful color and some bare. I truly love this time of year. As nature is readied for the long sleep of winter, I am reminded of our Creator God's amazing design. Colossians 1:16 -17 says, "... Everything was created through Jesus Christ and for Him. 17 He existed before anything else, and He holds all creation together." I love the way Paul expresses his confidence in Christ in this passage. Not only is He our Savior, but He is the one who holds all things together. Genesis 8:22 tells us, "As long as the earth remains, there will be planting and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night." (NLT) How long will this present earth remain, we do not know. For no one knows when Christ will return to take His loved ones home. "Our harvest being gotten in, our governor sent four men on fowling, that so we might after a special manner rejoice together, after we had gathered the fruits of our labors; they four in one day killed as much fowl, as with a little help beside, served the company almost a week, at which time amongst other recreations, we exercised our arms (shooting sports), many of the Indians coming amongst us, and amongst the rest their greatest king Massasoit, with some ninety men, whom for three days we entertained and feasted, and they went out and killed five deer, which they brought to the Plantation and bestowed on our Governor, and upon the Captain and others. And although it be not always so plentiful, as it was at this time with us, yet by the goodness of God, we are so far from want, that we often wish you partakers of our plenty."

Notice all worked together, including "the Indians" to provide for the needs of everyone and to celebrate the "goodness of God." I am thankful for all those who work hard to provide the food, in whatever capacity God has set them to. It is through His goodness that we are able to work and provide for our families. It is through His goodness that the crop grows and is able to be harvested. It is through His goodness that the seasons come and go, over and over again. This year as you begin to prepare for the feast that is before us, remember all that God has done for you, the way He has provided for your daily needs, and for your eternal need for salvation, and be truly thankful.
